

IOWAccess Funding



The IOWAccess Revolving Fund

The IOWAccess Revolving Fund was established for the purpose of:

maintaining, developing, operating, and expanding the IOWAccess initiative to enhance citizen access to government services or information at the State, county, or local level.

- ✓ FUNDED BY SALES OF DRIVER'S LICENSE RECORDS, NOT TAXES
- ✓ USED TO SUPPORT E-GOVERNMENT INITIATIVES
- ✓ PROVIDES PROJECT DEVELOPMENT AND STARTUP FUNDS

Funding for a project covers:

- ✓ Design
- ✓ Development and Rollout
- ✓ First Year Operating Expenses

Agencies are expected to cover maintenance and operating expenses beyond the first year.



The IOWAccess Advisory Council

Iowa Code established the 19-member IOWAccess Advisory Council to create and provide a service to citizens of the state that serves as a gateway for one-stop electronic access to governmental information and transactions at State, county, or local levels.

The IOWAccess Project Process

The IOWAccess Advisory Council has implemented a process, based

on information technology project management best practices, to assess the relative merits of projects submitted. **Initiation** requires the investment of a small amount of resources and creates a concept paper for consideration of project funding. **Scope Analysis** provides a more reliable estimate, defines the scope of the project, and provides resources to determine the return on investment. From the review of these deliverables, the IOWAccess Advisory Council will decide on funding the **Planning** phase. This phase is a detailed understanding of the project, full application design, and a statement of work to be used in deciding to fund the final development phase, **Execution**. This phase is the actual building, testing and rollout of the application, when it is ready for **Serving Citizens**.



Some IOWAccess Funded Projects

Since July, 2003 \$2.9 million in e-Government projects have been financially supported by IOWAccess, including: Online Iowa Sex Offender Registry; State Patrol Accident Reports; Licensing of Teachers, Engineers, Accountants; Online Food Inspections; Access to Water Pollution Control Permits; Licensing of Storage Tanks; Local Government Budget Transmission; and, Health Facility Licensing and Inspection.
